Answers

1. Abraham's call (Genesis 12) was a covenant of faith and obedience, symbolizing the beginning of God's chosen people.
2. The Ten Commandments (Exodus 20) guide moral and spiritual conduct, forming the basis of Judeo-Christian ethics.
3. Moses showed leadership in faith, obedience, communication, and justice, leading Israel from Egypt to Canaan.
4. David was a king after God's heart; God promised his dynasty would last forever, fulfilled in Jesus (2 Samuel 7).
5. Jesus taught love (Matthew 22:37-39) and forgiveness (Matthew 6:14-15) as core principles of Christian living.
6. The parable (Luke 15:11-32) teaches God's grace, repentance, and the joy of forgiveness.
7. Jesus' crucifixion (atonement for sins) and resurrection (victory over death) are central to salvation (Luke 23-24).
8. The Holy Spirit empowered the apostles at Pentecost (Acts 2), led evangelism, and enabled miracles and unity.
9. Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23): love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.
10. Paul's journeys (Acts 13-21) spread Christianity across Asia and Europe, planting churches and writing epistles.
